Subcommittee's purpose and Recommendation Level

Questions to answer: What areas can we make a recommendation around? Broad policy suggestions? Or at the programmatic?

- Goal #2 and Goal #5, Goal #1 (live and fully participate,), Goal #3, Goal #4 (caregiving) Workforce issues are directly in 2 of them and indirectly in 3 of them. We are cross-cutting.
- Two aspects of the workforce:
 - Do we have enough people to serve the older population? And do we have opportunities for older adults to stay in the workforce or for volunteer efforts.
 - What are we doing as a State to take advantage of the resource of older adults with lots of education and experience?
 - What are we doing to capture the entrepreneurial spirit? What are we doing to take advantage of the 65+ resources

Agreement:

- We are making recommendations to the Governor and the State legislation— Should be making recommendations around policy at a high level (rather than at the micro or programmatic level)
- As other bodies, organizations or individuals come on board, we can provide them more specific programmatic recommendations.

Short-term Priority Area¹.
