## **Key Takeaways and Notes:**

- Katherine Keegan, Director of the Office of Future Work, gave an update on work efforts amid the state's COVID-19 response. She noted that the current events have accelerated and intensified her work. Katherine highlighted the importance of skills that are "uniquely human" and referenced recent work related to automation and artificial intelligence – see <u>link</u>. Top priorities include:
  - Expanded unemployment benefits for gig workers
    - Department of Labor and Employment is looking specifically into unemployment among gig workers
  - Workplace protections and safety
  - o Digital transformation of work and consensus around digital literacy
    - Defining digital literacy and gain greater clarity around the concept
  - Expanding remote work opportunities for older adults
    - Recent <u>research</u> suggests 40% of the workforce could work remotely
  - Developing targeted efforts for displaced workers and low wage workers
  - o Future trend to keep in mind for recommendations: older adults and remote work
  - Lifelong learning and education that is accessible and linked with work connect learning and working is critical
