Contract: CDPHE posted RFP on 4/23 to seek external private vaccine provider(s) to support this work. Closing date of 5/24


State


CDPHE State Lab: Leverage contractors to deploy vaccines with State support for scheduling, routing, troubleshooting, etc

Community Health and Planning

Guiding Policies from the American Planning Association:

- 1. Engage older adults and apply a demographic lens to planning

- 3. Ensure access to safe and reliable transportation options support transit-oriented development
- 4. Use land-use and zoning tools to create integrated communities that foster social engagement and connectedness
- 5. Support local economic development policies and planning that supports paid and unpaid caregivers
- 6. Draw on older adults as a community asset
