- Presentations by Ed Leary, Chair, and Steve Child, SAPGA member on promoting Age-friendly communities.
- Presentations from AARP, City of Boulder Adult Services, and the Colorado Association of Area Agencies on Aging on local policy implementation efforts.

Regional Meetings - Update:

Direct Care Workforce Collaborative:

- Seeing a necessity for collaboration to advance systems, HCPF has convened core leaders to the <u>Direct Care Workforce Collaborative</u> to collaborate, support, recruit, and retain Colorado's direct care workforce.

- Action groups are led by stakeholders and work to identify policy strategies and plans for moving them forward. Includes participation by a number of state agencies, including DOLA, CDPHE, CDLE, Higher Ed, Governor's and Lt. Governor's office, etc.

- In-home vaccination for homebound Coloradans update

- Needs assessment for Serve Colorado, please participate, closes Friday, May 21st.
- 2021 Priorities:
 - Lifelong Colorado submitted to AARP national and approved by the Governor and Lt.
 Governor. Includes synthesis of SAPGA work since 2015 and emphasizes health equity across
 the lifespan. Build on tenants of social determinants of health and community health.
 Partners include American Planning Assoc. to look at lived spaces, parks, etc. Will include
 elements of built design and inclusion moving forward. Also has eight goals from 2016 action
 plan. Next step will be to incorporate metrics and host webinars on local community
 planning.
 - Senior Advisor Aging position has the go-ahead to work with Budget office to piece together funding to continue. Work towards legislation that will build an office for Lifelong Colorado.

Community Highlight: Jefferson County Age Friendly Efforts, Karin Stewart, Aging & Adult Services Program Manager, Jefferson County; SAPGA Member & Rachel Cohen, Principal, Aging Dynamics

- Presentation Slides; Jefferson County Age-Friendly website; Jefferson County info sign-up
- How does work at state level translate down to local level? Jefferson County has a long history of looking at aging issues starting in 2008 with Living Well.
- Five communities did boomer bond initiative.
- Looking to align with Lifelong Colorado, joining in 2019.
- Building inclusion into work, developed a steering committee to govern work that includes planning members and community members and stakeholders.
- Use domains of livability as framework, emphasizing a needs-based approach AND strengths-based approach to create a solution focused action plan.
- Right now, the initiative is focused on community engagement to create a bi-directional communication for all implementation between community members and initiative coordinators
- Working on defining "Age-friendly", finding different meanings for different people.
- Began community information gathering project in January of 2020 which includes survey (200 responses), and interviews. Focus of interviews/surveys on respect and social inclusion,

communication, and information. Action plan will also include housing, transportation, other priorities identified in the surveys, etc.

Community Highlight: Colorado Springs Age Friendly Efforts - Mayling Rodriguez, Program Manager, Innovations in Aging Collaborative

- Innovations in Aging Collaboration who work to elevate the voices of older folks serve as backbone organization for the initiative.
- Creating a strategic plan to make age-friendly initiative incorporating the eight domains of livability.
- Incorporate a collaborative process
- Pivoting with COVID to engaging community virtually.
- Working to promote technology equity with potential for a pilot that will facilitate intergenerational learning exchange.

Building an Age Friendly Public Health System: Megan Wolfe, Trust for America's Health (TFAH)

- Presentation Slides
- Trust for America's Health focuses on emergency preparedness, obesity, etc., healthy aging work started in 2017.
- Public health approach, emphasis on what we do as a society to prevent health issues
- Areas where public health can intervene to improve older adult health, nutrition, housing, tobacco, etc.
- 80% of older adults have at least 1 chronic condition
- Age-friendly public health systems can improve older adult health outcomes
 - promote equity
 - change social determinants of health
 - · address social isolation
- TFHA started work in 2017 convening stakeholders asking the question "Can public health play a role in a healthy aging 'framework'?
- Tested framework with 5 C's of an Age-Friendly public health system in Florida pilot
 - Connecting & convening
 - Coordinating
 - Collecting and disseminating data
 - Communicating
 - Complementing and supplementing
 - Entered into Phase II with expansion to Michigan, Mississippi, and Washington. (See https://afphs.org/afphs-network/ for additional information.)
- Gabriel with CDPHE has integrated this age friendly approach beginning in 2017 into CDPHE's
 approach. All 10 pieces of framework are in place and they are using a SDOH lens. Jarett is looking to
 THFA to get CDPHE designated as an age friendly agency.
